Armbrust asked about the distances of the food truck. If Huckleberry's were to close down, like before, we could have the option of parking a food truck in front. Ollis responded the ordinance states "Any food truck on privately owned property must be positioned at least 150 feet from the customer entrance of an existing restaurant during its hours of operation." Ingham responded if they are closed, he has no problem with the food truck being there. Ollis said the ordinance gives us some flexibility as far as where they can operate. In the Central Business District and in any other place with town approval. The 150 feet is in Transitional District. Left it open to residential also. If someone is getting married and needs a food truck in their backyard, they can do that also, with the hours of operation and noise under consideration. He feels this is the best we could do protecting the businesses we have and new ones coming in. Armbrust replied this was his only concern.

Commissioner Crowell played music on his phone that he heard while at his home, coming from Huckleberry's. A little on the loud side. They need to be more respectful of the town. Ingham suggested asking them to turn it down some.

Booker reported at the concert at Rogers Park, people were commenting the music was too low. Armbrust felt it was the most well diversified representation of all concerts. Everyone agreed it was a very good concert.

Booker asked about parked RV's in the area. Ollis will check the ordinance. He knows you can have one for so many days, but you shouldn't be living in them.
